

Job search opportunity card

The opportunity card (Section 20a of the Residence Act [AufenthG]) improves your chances of making contact with German employers and finding qualified employment in Germany. Further information are available at Make it in Germany.com.

Conditions:

- 1. Qualification obtained in Germany or full equivalence of qualification obtained abroad, or
- 2. State-recognized higher education or vocational qualification abroad (for vocational qualifications: at least two years training period): Apply for information from the Central Office for Foreign Education (ZAB), or
- 3. Professional qualification positively recognized by the <u>BIBB</u> from a German Chamber of Commerce Abroad (AHK) of category A: ask the AHK about the requirements.

For cases 2 and 3 additionally:

- A score of at least six points in the points system.
- o Proof of language skills: German at a min. level of A1 or English at a min. level of B2

Applications can be submitted in person, with prior appointment and the following application documents:

- Personally signed passport (original with one copy of the passport data page), with at least two completely empty pages and sufficient validity
- Valid Swiss residence permit with one copy
- Application form fully completed and signed including declaration to section 54 residence
 Act: application form with one copy
- One passport sized photo no older than three months, according to biometric standards
- o Proof of recognition of foreign qualification in original with one copy
- Proof of qualification: original diploma and if requested equivalency of the foreign qualification from <u>ZAB</u> or <u>BIBB</u> with one copy
- o Proof of language skills for Option 2: German level A1 or English Level B2 (GER)
- Proof of financial means:
 - Own funds on bank account: own bank statements of the last 3 months (containing a minimum of €1,027 net per month, for twelve month) or

Secondary employment: If you already have a specific part-time job in Germany in prospect, you can provide evidence of this in the form of an employment contract or a binding job offer stating the weekly working hours and monthly earnings or

blocked bank account confirmation (containing a minimum of €1,027 net per month, for twelve month) or a declaration of commitment.



- Health insurance in line with EU standards (covering the entire Schengen area, min. coverage of 30,000 €, valid from the day of entry for twelve month
- o Detailed **motivation letter** in German or English language
- o Detailed **curriculum vitae** in German or English language
- Postage expenses of 7 Swiss Francs
- Visa fee of 75 Euro payable by cash in Swiss Francs, by Visa or MasterCard (information <u>here</u>)

Please prepare the originals with **one set** of copies of all the indicated documents. Original documents will be return to you while a copy per set will be required. Missing documentation delays the procedure and can result in your application being rejected.

The German Embassy Bern reserve the right to ask for additional documents at any time during the processing of your application.

In this visa category, most applications are typically processed within 2-3 weeks. Please do not contact the mission abroad to check the status of your application during the normal processing period. Such inquiries are extremely time-consuming for the visa department and cannot be answered. We will contact you by email as soon as the decision has been made.

This visa will be issued with a validity of 12 months. Opportunity cards are issued initially as job search opportunity cards for a maximum of one year. The card allows you to look for gainful employment in Germany, i.e. you can seek employment or become self-employed. While you are looking for gainful employment, you are allowed to have one or more part-time jobs (secondary employment) totaling 20 hours a week. You can also do job trials for a maximum of two weeks per employer as part of your job search. The aim of the job trial must be either to obtain qualified employment, an apprenticeship or a qualification program.
