



Visa for skilled workers holding a university degree

Last update: February 2025

As a skilled worker with an academic qualification recognised in Germany, you can be issued with a residence permit to engage in skilled employment. You can find more about living and working in Germany at www.make-it-in-germany.com.

The application is only possible online through the Consular Services Portal. Your application will then be checked for completeness. Communication regarding any additional information needed will be done directly through the Consular Services Portal. An appointment can only be booked afterwards.

Apply now online [here](#) and upload the following documents:

- Personally signed **passport** (original with one copy of the passport data page), with at least two completely empty pages and sufficient validity
- Valid **Swiss residence** permit with one copy
- **Application form** fully completed: [application form](#) and signed information pursuant section 82 (1) residence act
- One passport sized **photo** – no older than three months, according to biometric standards
- **Employer's declaration** ("[declaration of employment](#)") to be completed by your employer in Germany
- **Work contract** original and **job description**
- Original **German university degree** or **recognized foreign university** degree with one copy and printouts from [Anabin data base](#) - the qualification and academic institution need to be listed as equivalent or comparable and the university need to be rated with H+
or
Statement of comparability for foreign higher education qualifications, issued by the central office for foreign education ([ZAB](#)) in original with one copy
- Detailed **curriculum vitae** in German or English language
- Postage expenses of 7 Swiss Francs
- Visa fee of 75 Euro payable by cash in Swiss Francs, by Visa or MasterCard (information [here](#))

Appointment scheduling for the blue card is possible after your documents have been reviewed. You will then receive a link for booking an appointment. The application can only be submitted in person at your previously booked appointment at the visa section of the embassy (Willadingweg 78, 3006 Bern).

At your appointment, please present all original documents and your [biometric photos](#).

The German Embassy Bern reserve the right to ask for additional documents at any time during the processing of your application.

In this visa category, most applications are typically processed within 3-5 weeks. Please do not contact the mission abroad to check the status of your application during the normal processing period. Such inquiries are extremely time-consuming for the visa department and cannot be answered. We will contact you by email as soon as the decision has been made.

The visa will be valid for 12 months and allows you to start working. You can travel in the entire Schengen area for 90 days per half year.
